

In addition to welcoming to « La Guyonnière », we also hope that everybody's interest, each person spontaneously abides by the following internal rules which we advise you to fully take note of before presenting the necessary documents for registration with the person in charge of the campsite.

Campers will be able to choose their site according to the campsite manager's indications, only after having registered.

1- Admission requirements :

In order to enter, to get set up and remain on the campsite, you must have authorisation from the person in charge at the reception office (or the manager). Remaining on the campsite of "La Guyonnière" implies the acceptance of the following rules and the commitments to adhere to them.

Infringement of these rules could involve the expulsion of those responsible for the act.

In the event of a serious offence, the manager may have resort to bringing in the Police force.

2- Police formalities:

Any person staying at least one night on the campsite must present his/her identity papers beforehand to the person in charge at the reception office and must fill the formalities required by the Police.

3- Setting up :

The tent or caravan and material must be installed within the indicated site according to the manager's instructions.

4- Reception office :

Open from 9.00am to 7.00pm from Monday to Saturday and from 9.00am to 12.00am on Sunday from the 1st of July till the 31st of August and from 12.00 am till 2.00p.m and from 5.00p.m till 7.00pm from Monday to Saturday the rest of the opening period.

At the reception office, you will find all the information you need on the campsite facilities, information on food/drink supply possibilities, sports facilities, the places of interest in surrounding areas and various useful addresses.

5- Fees :

Fees must be paid at the reception office and are set according to the tariff displayed. They are calculated according to the number of nights spent on the camp. Campers are invited to inform the reception office of their departure one day in advance. Campers intending to leave before the reception office's opening hours must settle their payment the day before their departure.

6-A – Noises and silence:

The campsite users are requested to avoid noise and discussions which could disturb their neighbours. Sound/music equipment must be regulated accordingly. Closings of cars doors and boots must be as discrete as possible.

There must be total silence from 10.00pm to 7.00am. From 10.00 pm to 8.00am all noisy activities such as singing and calls must be avoided.

6-B- Pets:

Dogs and other pets must be constantly kept on a leash. They must not be left alone on the campsite by their owners, even when locked up. Masters are civilly responsible for their pets.

7-Visitors:

Visitors are authorised on the campsite and are under the full responsibility of the campers who invite them. Campers must ensure payment for their guests who use the installations of the camping the course of the day.

8-Vehicles driving and parking:

Within the campsite vehicles must respect the 10km/h speed limit.

Driving is prohibited between 10.00pm and 7.00am.

Inside the campsite only vehicles belonging to the campers can circulate. Parking is strictly prohibited on the sites usually occupied by campsite shelters and should not, moreover, block driving, nor prevent the new arrivals setting up.

9-Clothing and behaviour

: Dress code is required.

Words, songs etc... likely to shock neighbours and particularly children, must not be used.

Political or religious discussions and commercial propaganda are strictly forbidden inside the campsite. Campers with a contagious disease (whooping-cough, etc) will not be admitted into the campsite.

10- Hygiene and respect of equipment and buildings:

Each camper is held to abstain from any action which could be detrimental to the cleanliness, hygiene and general appearance of the campsite.

It is forbidden to throw polluted water on the ground or in the gutters.

The household waste; waste of any nature or papers must be deposited in the dustbins.

Campers must always throw their polluted water in the installations dedicated to this purpose.

The sanitary facilities must be maintained in a constant state of cleanliness by the users.

Washing is strictly forbidden apart from the vats dedicated from this purpose.

The hanging out of clothes and bed-linen to dry should be done, if necessary, within the common drying area allocated. However it will be tolerated until 10.00am near the shelters, as long as it is as discrete as possible and not annoying for the neighbours. The clothes line should not be attached to trees.

The floral plantations and decorations must be respected. It is strictly forbidden for the camper to hammer nails in the trees, to cut branches or to make gardens.

It is forbidden to delimit a site by personal means, or to dig the ground.

Any degradation to the vegetation, the fence, and the ground or campsite installations will be the responsibility of the perpetrators.

The site which is used during the stay must be left in its initial state.

11-Safety:

a)Fire.

Open fires (using wood-coal) are strictly prohibited. Stoves must be maintained in perfect operating condition, and must not be used under a tent or close to a car.

Fire extinguishers are at everyone's disposal. In the event of a fire occurring, you must warn the management immediately.

A first-aid kit is available at the reception office.

While campsite guardians are present, campers are invited to take the usual precautions in looking after their material.

b) Theft:

The management is only responsible for objects deposited at the reception office. Campers are fully responsible for their tents/caravans and are asked to report any suspicious behaviour to the campsite manager.

12- Games

Rough games must not be organized near installations. The meeting-room must not be used for rowdy games.

13- "Dead parking":

Un-used material/equipment can only be left on the site after agreement from the manager and in a designated area.

The management is not responsible for this material in the owner's absence.

A fee must be paid for this service for which the amount to be paid will be posted at the reception office.

14- Campsite manager:

He/she is responsible for order and good behaviour in the campsite. He/she is responsible for sanctioning serious infringements to internal rules described previously and, if necessary, to expel those responsible.

A book of complaints or a special box intended to receive complaints is at your disposal. Complaints will be taken into account only if they are signed and dated, referring to recent facts and as specific as possible.

15- Any infringement to the present set of rules will involve the expulsion of the perpetrator.
